A MATURE & PUBLIC COMMITMENT TO FOLLOW JESUS

Thanks be to God for all you who have made a mature public affirmation of your faith and commitment to the promises of your Baptism. Since I began as your rector, I have presented these persons for confirmation.

Thanks be to God there are hundreds of "cradle Episcopalians" at All Saints. You were born and raised in The Episcopal Church. Your roots run deep in "the faith as we have received it" at All Saints. But there are many who have called All Saints

their church home for many years but have never "been confirmed," as we say in common parlance around here. In fact, several have asked recently, "So, what is Confirmation? Should I be confirmed?"

As stated above, the sacramental rite of confirmation is when one says publicly that she is a Christian, and decidedly so. For many, that involves a time of preparation as the promises made in Holy Baptism by his parents are explored more fully.

The Prayer Book says,

Q: What is Confirmation?

A: Confirmation is the rite in which we express a mature commitment to Christ, and receive strength from the Holy Spirit through prayer and the laying on of hands by a bishop.

Q: What is required of those to be confirmed?

A: It is required of those to be confirmed that they have been baptized, are sufficiently instructed in the Christian Faith, are penitent for their sins, and are ready to affirm their confession of Jesus Christ as Savior and Lord.

-The Book of Common Prayer, p. 860

Would you like to make your confirmation publicly of the faith as we have received it and of your responsibilities as a baptized Christian? After spending some time with me at All Saints 101 or in personal conversation or in a Confirmation Course, this is an appropriate next step to take in your membership at All Saints.



confirmation at all saints

Confirmation is about more than joining a church or transferring your membership to All Saints. These are “the last days,” as we say in Eucharistic Prayer B. This is the age between Jesus’ first appearance and His promised return. When you prepare for Confirmation, or if you are already confirmed, when you prepare to reaffirm your faith, you are choosing to recover your life by choosing the ancient path of following Jesus with those who have gone before us and what they found most helpful in their discipleship. That ancient path is what we explore in Starting Point, All Saints 101, this fall’s Alpha Course for adults and students, and the Confirmation Course.

Whether you are confirmed, or on the fence about all things Anglican or Episcopalian, I thank my God for all you and pray that in our life together in Christ at All Saints we will

“grasp how wide and long and high and deep is the love of Christ, and to know this love that surpasses knowledge—that you may be filled to the measure of all the fullness of God”
-Ephesians 3.18,19.

The *reconciling* love of God in Christ — knowing Him, experiencing Him, coming to terms with His unconditional love — or however you might describe this divine connection — changes everything. Absolutely everything. •

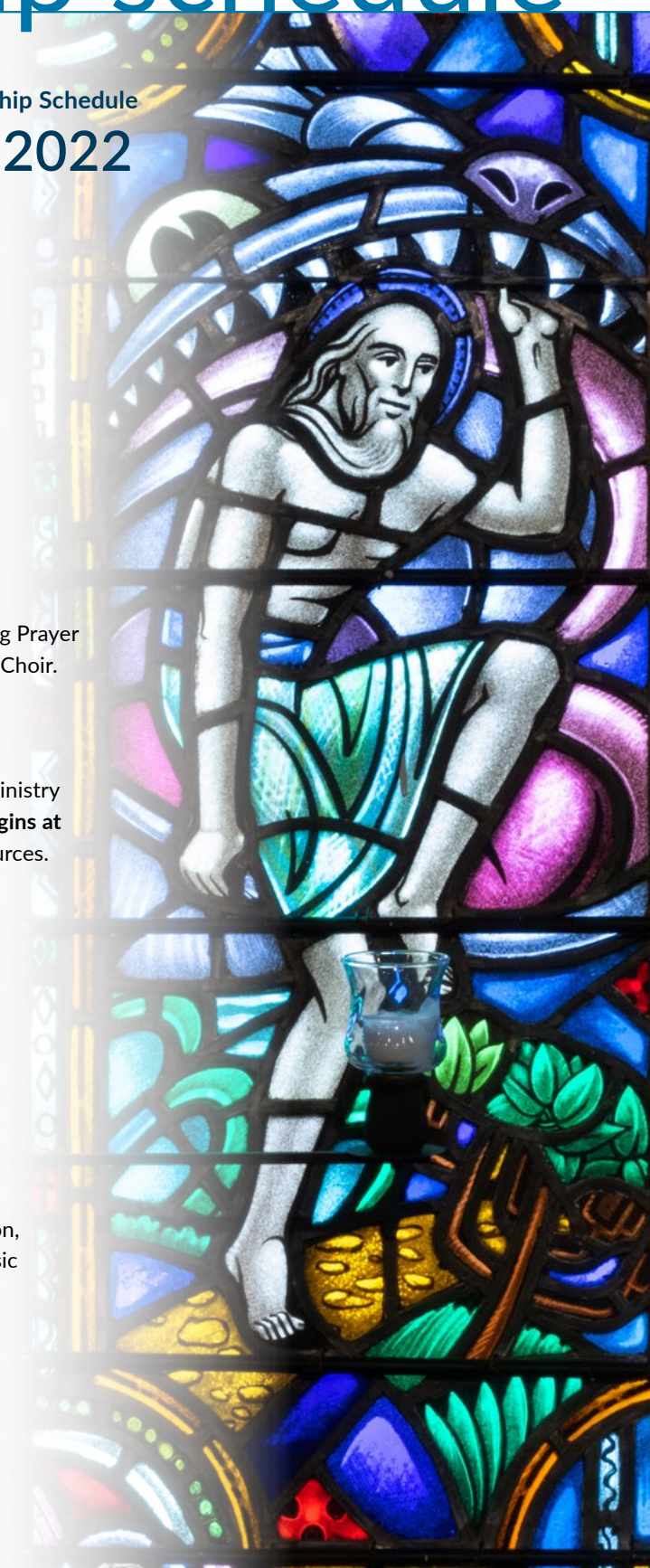

ANGLICAN COMMUNION.

As these terms come up at Starting Point or All Saints 101, as well as in the news cycle in the months ahead, we are reminded that Episcopalians are part of a global movement of Christians. The Anglican Communion is one of the world's largest Christian communities in the world. Tens of millions of Anglicans in more than 165 countries are still responding to the theological and liturgical event known as the English Reformation.

The impact of Christ's Gospel upon the hearts and minds of Thomas Cranmer, Hugh Latimer, Anne Boleyn, William Tyndale, Jane Grey, Nicholas Ridley, Anne Askew, and so many more has not ceased its influence upon us all. This summer provides us with a vantage point to witness that divine force upon the institutions that are rooted in this great spiritual heritage.

80TH GENERAL CONVENTION, BALTIMORE, JULY 7 – 14, 2022

General Convention is the national legislative body of the Episcopal Church. It consists of a House of Bishops, which includes all active and retired bishops, and a House of Deputies, which includes four lay persons and four clergy from each diocese, each area mission, and the Convocation of the American Churches in Europe. The Convention meets every three years. The Houses meet and act separately, and both must concur to adopt legislation. The General Convention alone has authority to amend the Prayer Book and the church's Constitution, to amend the canons (laws) of the church, and to determine the program and budget of the General Convention, including the missionary, educational, and social programs it authorizes. A majority of bishops may request the Presiding Bishop to call a Special General Convention. Special General Conventions met in 1821 and in 1969. The General Convention elects twenty of the forty members of the Executive Council, which administers policy and program between the triennial meetings of the General Convention.

Due to the pandemic the 80th General Convention was postponed from last summer until this summer when they will gather in Baltimore, Maryland, July 7-14. The names of our bishops and deputies and alternates from the Episcopal Diocese of Central Florida follow, and for each of them we pray.

THE 15TH LAMBETH CONFERENCE JULY 26 – AUGUST 8, 2022

Convened by The Archbishop of Canterbury in 2022, the Lambeth Conference is a gathering of bishops from across the Anglican Communion for prayer and reflection, fellowship and dialogue on church and world affairs. The Conference has met at ten-year intervals, except during time of war, pandemic, and to avoid schism.

With the theme of 'God's Church for God's World - walking, listening and witnessing together,' the conference will explore what it means for the Anglican Communion to be responsive to the needs of a 21st Century world.

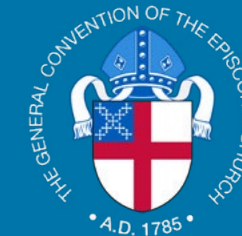
The first Lambeth Conference met in 1867, marking the occasion when the various

churches of the Anglican Communion began to be conscious of themselves as a single family of churches rooted in the theological and liturgical heritage of the English Reformation.

The immediate cause of the first gathering was an effort on the part of several bishops to respond to the unsettling effects of the publication of Essays and Reviews and the "Colenso controversy." The "Colenso controversy" followed the arraignment of John Colenso, Bishop of Natal, on charges of heresy for holding "advanced" views of the creation stories in the OT. The debate aroused intense feelings. A jurisdictional dispute between two bishops in South Africa regarding the controversy became a matter of concern for all the colonial churches of England.

In 1867 Charles Thomas Longley, Archbishop of Canterbury, responding to an appeal from Canada, invited Anglican bishops from all over the world to Lambeth for the purposes of mutual discussion and consultation. The meeting, neither a synod nor general council, was a purely informal gathering of bishops meeting at the invitation of the Archbishop of Canterbury. The informal gathering command considerable moral authority. From time to time it has made significant pronouncements, notably its Appeal to All Christian People (1920) and Resolution I.10 on Human Sexuality (1998), both major ecumenical documents. Lambeth Conference has also been the occasion for the launch of new ministry, such as **Five Talents** in 1998, a Christian charity that provides savings programs, financial literacy, and business training for those in need in developing countries.

The numbers have been staggering. Over fourteen million Ukrainians have fled their country since the Russian invasion. To date over two million Ukrainians have returned, an estimated 30,000 persons crossing borders daily.

All Saints has contributed to the relief of God's people in Ukraine in two ways through the Rector's Discretionary Fund and office.

First, by supporting the tremendous effort by the **Church of England's Diocese of Europe** to assist refugees. Second, by supporting the work of **Mission Possible**. **Fr. Shelby** has championed Mission Possible since he met their leadership in Eastern Europe and Russia in the 1990s. In February of this year, Fr. Shelby was invited to join the Board.

FROM MISSION POSSIBLE PRESIDENT IGNAT IVANOV

Thirty years ago, the Iron Curtain came down, and a new era began in Eastern Europe. Mission Possible's work changed; "Bible smuggling" was no longer needed. For many years Odesa, Ukraine, became the hub center for our work. Among other projects, we trained church planters. The picture below shows one group of such missionaries in 1992 with a much younger me on the left.



The war in Ukraine affects the whole world. A new era has begun again in Eastern Europe, and no one yet knows what it will look like. In any case, Mission

Possible will continue to spread the gospel and provide help!

OUR HELP FOR UKRAINE IS FOCUSED ON THOSE WHO REMAIN IN THE COUNTRY

We have given support for the accommodation of refugees on the Romanian side of the border, but most of our aid goes directly into Ukraine. For many years our team has been sharing the gospel and helping in the villages of the Odesa region. The circumstances within that region were miserable even before the war. For the residents there in urgent need, we are distributing aid packages, plus emotional and spiritual support in the midst of their distress.

Our goal is to steadily provide support over several months, if possible. We hope and pray that the Odesa region will stay relatively safe, that work can continue from our operational center there, and that resources will remain available.

OUR WORK IN RUSSIA WILL CONTINUE AS CLOSE TO NORMAL AS POSSIBLE.

Team members are working hard to ensure the crisis does not adversely affect the lives of the children and families served through our shelter homes. The situation in Russia is tense, and the authorities have tightened their control and scrutiny considerably. However, the support we have sent to Russia has been received; there are banks that are still able to transfer our financial aid.

IT IS AT A TIME LIKE THIS THAT THE CHURCH IS MOST NEEDED

When the times are very dark and uncertain, the Church is greatly needed. We have a message of hope for those who have lost everything. Thankfully,

Christian organizations, congregations, and individual families have been able to provide aid to Ukraine in the midst of this great crisis.

For our part, Mission Possible has been able to help thousands of people. Though it may be small compared to the suffering of an entire nation, it is essential for those we have been able to assist in the right place at the right time.

Please pray for protection for our ministry, the people we reach out to, and our teams.

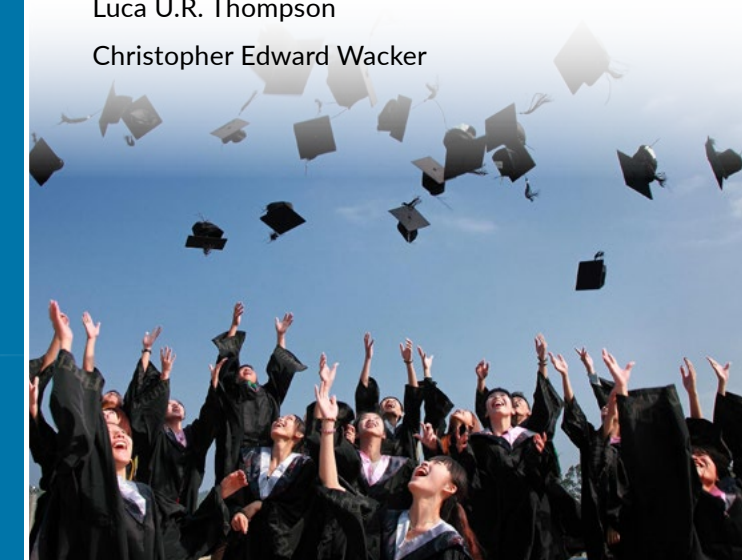

THE REV. LO COOK WELCOME TO ALL SAINTS

With great joy and confidence in the mission and ministry God has entrusted to All Saints, I welcome the **Reverend Laura "Lo" Cook** as a member of the parish clergy. Ordained as a deacon at the Cathedral Church of St. Luke on January 31, Rev. Lo begins June 1 as Curate at All Saints. Upon her ordination as a priest at All Saints, Rev. Lo will become Associate Rector and assist us in sacramental and discipleship ministries, including missions and outreach.

Rev. Lo was born and raised in Central Florida. She grew up at Church of the Messiah, Winter Garden. She says mission immersions with her youth group including Soul in the City had a profound impact on her life.

Rev. Lo graduated from the University of Florida with a B.A. in Education in 2011 and a M.A. in Education in 2013. She taught Grades 3-5 and supported other teachers and their students at Palmetto Elementary School.

Rev. Lo has also served as a missionary in Uganda. She brought a renewed focus on education, fundraising, communication, and strategic development as a member of the team for Saving Grace (Uganda). Rev. Lo says, "I would say I started to hear God's call to ordained ministry when I was younger. I started to sense it again in Uganda in 2017." Rev. Lo began to discern God's call on her life with her rector the Rev. Tom Rutherford and parish leaders when she returned to Orlando in 2018.

In 2019 the Diocese of Central Florida confirmed Rev. Lo's call to ordained ministry and sent her to Wycliffe College, University of Toronto. We heard just a little bit about what her time in seminary during the pandemic has been like when she preached at All Saints at the beginning of Lent.

About joining All Saints leadership, Rev. Lo said she sees the Parish as "a place where lives are transformed by the love, growth, learning, and communal discernment



that happens in conjunction with God's mission." As she makes this transition, Rev. Lo reaches for a favorite Bible verse, *"The LORD will watch over your coming and going both now and forevermore"* -Psalm 121.8

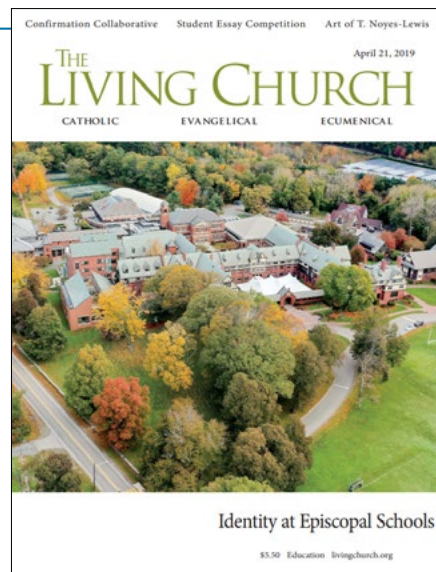

the search for our bishop

DIOCESAN PROFILE AND NEXT STEPS IN DISCERNMENT

In the spring of 2021, the Rt. Rev. Gregory O. Brewer, Bishop of the Diocese of Central Florida, communicated to the Standing Committee his plans to retire in July 2023 at age 72, as required by the canons of The Episcopal Church. Bishop Brewer officially announced his pending retirement at the 2022 Diocesan Convention in late January. By that time, the Standing Committee had initiated the process of finding a new bishop, including the appointment of the Search Committee.

After approval from the Standing Committee, the diocesan profile was posted online in English and Spanish, and nominations opened May 1. The Search Committee is scheduled to receive nominations through May 31. Per the Search Committee's Charge, nominations were to come from "a priest canonically resident in the Diocese of Central Florida and another communicant in good standing (lay or ordained) from the Diocese of Central Florida."

The Rector is a member of the Search Committee, and Fr. Shelby asks the Parish to join the Diocese in prayer for the next bishop.

Almighty God, giver of every good gift: Look graciously on your Church, and so guide the minds of those who shall choose a Bishop for this Diocese that we may receive a faithful pastor who will preach the Gospel, care for your people, equip us for ministry, and lead us forth in fulfillment of the Great Commission; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

The summer months in front of the Search Committee include screening, interviews, and background checks

of potential nominees, followed by a discernment retreat for nominees with the Search Committee. Fr. Shelby says, "Thanks be to God for the Daughters of the King and the mighty network of intercessors at All Saints and across the diocese."
